





All these factors mean that Ticino can confidently compete with other tax-favourable global regions like Dubai or Monte





Ticino Real Estate Market Trends

In recent years, Ticino's real estate market has undergone significant developments, reflecting both global trends and regional specifics. These shifts provide valuable insights for those looking to understand the market and explore investment opportunities.







General Market Trend

Over the past two decades, the Ticino real estate market has shown steady growth. According to RealAdvisor, in 21 years, the average price per square metre increased by 66.9% for houses and 70.8% for apartments, indicating strong appeal to both local buyers and foreign investors.

 with a price per square metre of CHF 6,683.
- Apartments:
 The average price is CHF 807,076,
 with an average price per square metre of CHF 8,071.

Recent Price Changes

In the past 12 months, property prices in Ticino have seen minimal changes. The price per square metre for houses fell by 2.09%, while the purchase price for apartments rose by 0.87%.



Supply and Demand

On the other hand, "rustici" (a beloved Ticino speciality – small, old stone houses often located far outside current building zones) remain a unique and often under-utilised asset.

Starting in the 1950s, Germany's financial elite settled here. The last major wave came in the 1980s, when Northern Italian industrialists fled political unrest.

Today, the largest group by far is the cross-border workforce, with Italian commuters making up 20% of Ticino's total population.
